Hello Everyone!

It is with great disappointment that I have to inform you that this years National Novena to Our Lady of Knock is postponed. The Novena, which has taken place every year since 1977 from the 14th – 22nd August, has been the jewel of the pilgrimage season for us all.

Having discussed the issue of the Novena at the Shrine's Covid-19 committee, we concluded that it would be simply impossible to control in a safe manner the large outdoor gatherings of people which would undoubtedly come. The health and safety of our parishioners, pilgrims, priests, staff and volunteers is the first consideration for us at this worrying time.

The economic consequences for us all, the Shrine and local community will be very difficult but I think you will agree that it is the right decision.

While we may have a chance to celebrate a Novena later in the year, we will take advice and see what happens over the next number of months. It may be the case that we will have no Novena until August of 2021 - the times are very unpredictable.

The Shrine remains open of course with 3 Masses per day, at 12, 3 and 7:30 in the Basilica. Confessions, our Mass card office, bookshop and outdoor candleabrum are all available for everyone visiting the Shrine. In all these locations, strict queueing and social distancing measures apply.

I would like to advise our parishioners that the 7:30pm Mass is the less attended of the 3 Masses and is the one I would recommend to you for easy access. Once again at this time the Sunday obligation is transferred to any day of the week during the pandemic and there is now a 7:30 Mass in the Basilica on a Sunday evening.

I wish to thank again all our volunteers without whom nothing would happen, they are a credit to our Shrine and parish. If there is anyone who would like to volunteer please make contact with Monica Morley at the Shrine.

Thank you all for your patience and cooperation - don't worry too much, there are far, far better times ahead for all of us ! Keep the Faith!
