It would be enough to drive anyone to despair!

All our hearts went out to the survivors of the Mother and Baby homes and the tragic stories that emerged. Personally, it was very difficult reading, and my mind is still trying to comprehend how situations of neglect were allowed to happen in supposed care homes. It is something that we will never forget and are deeply ashamed of. Archbishop Michael Neary gave an apology and said:

"What the report makes clear to me is that when the Church is not serving with compassion, it is failing. For that I am genuinely sorry. As a Church leader I apologise unreservedly."

I think all of us who work in the Church can echo those words.
